

OBITUARY

In Neubrucke, Germany, on November 29, 1956, a luminous spirit traversed the cosmos and entered the world as the son of Carrie C. Battle and her husband, SFC Hinton G. Battle of the US Army. They bestowed upon him the name Hinton Govorn Battle, Jr., and he emerged as one of the most extraordinary, revered, and cherished artists to ever grace the Broadway stage and the silver screen. Collaborating with some of the most influential director/choreographers of all time, including George Faison in the original production of "The Wiz," Bob Fosse in the original production of "Dancin'," and Michael Bennett in the Broadway production of "Dreamgirls," Hinton left an indelible mark on the world of performing arts.





He garnered three Tony Awards for three distinctly remarkable roles in — "Sophisticated Ladies," "Tap Dance Kid," and "Miss Saigon"—earning him the distinction of being the most decorated Featured Actor in a Musical in history. Hinton's innate talent for dance blossomed from a young age. He commenced his training at the renowned Jones Haywood School of Ballet in Washington DC, and after three years, secured a full scholarship at the School of American Ballet in New York under the tutelage of George Balanchine.

Hinton's ascent as a consummate triplethreat garnered him accolades such as NAACP Image Awards, the Fred Astaire Award, the Ira Aldridge Award, the Midtown International Theater Festival Award, the Big Kidz Foundation Champion of the Arts Award, The Planet Connection Award, and the AMAS 2014 Rosie Award for Lifetime Achievement.



As a masterful dancer, singer, actor, choreographer, writer, and director, Hinton seamlessly transitioned from stage to screen, leaving an indelible mark on projects ranging from "Buffy The Vampire Slayer" to "Sister, Sister," "Fired Up," "The Trouble With Norman," and "The Boys." His choreographic brilliance illuminated the Academy Awards and Golden Globe Awards, culminating in his mesmerizing work on the big screen for the OUTKAST-led movie "Idlewild." Notably, he portrayed a memorable character in the film "Dreamgirls," opposite Jamie Foxx.

In his final years, Hinton devoted himself to penning his autobiography and a children's book titled "My Huge Secret." Additionally, he felt deeply honored to be featured in The Microsoft Legacy Project Virtual Museum's "Black History Month 2022 Experience."



Yet, amidst his many accomplishments, Hinton's greatest joy was the establishment of the Hinton Battle Dance Academy (HBDA) in 2017, alongside his co-founder Yoshimoto Kogyo. Through HBDA, he mentored aspiring talents, guiding them toward successful careers in the entertainment industry and in life.



On January 29th, Hinton passed on to join God's Grand Ensemble, continuing his journey of inspiring creativity and dance in that eternal light. On March 12th, the Lights of All Broadway Theaters were dimmed in his honor.

Hinton is survived by his sisters, Eddie and Lettie Battle, and cherished in memory by a multitude of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends. He reunites with his mother, Carrie, father, Hinton, Sr. and brothers LaNard and Kirk, in eternal rest.
